From the Church Council Chairperson:

We are coming upon that time of year. You have no doubt heard the announcements regarding seats on Commissions that need filling, nominations, discerning your gifts, etc. And, as you may have noticed in the AGM report book, there are MANY empty seats. We have been attending to church business without a Vice Chairperson, without any Members at Large, by combining Home and World Ministries, we are down to only two people on Education, two people on Finance, and a Personnel Commission that will be down to zero members as of the AGM. Next February, Worship and Music will also be down to zero members. And then we have our Youth programs...Jr and Sr Youth along with both girls and boys Ventures and our Sunday school programs...we are still searching for volunteers for these programs.

Of course, Covid and the lack of being "in church" together has not helped this situation, but the truth is, we have been through many years of trying to fill empty seats on commissions or finding volunteers for various programs. And every year there has been more and more of a reluctance to join/help. As a result, we have been working with smaller and smaller commissions and adjusting our programs to work with fewer and fewer volunteers. In other words, we have been putting a band-aid on the symptoms rather than fixing the problem.

So, what is the problem? We believe that one of the problems is that we are using a church leadership structure that was created for a much larger congregation. One of 600 people. And it simply cannot work for a church of our current size and demographic. Using a model that doesn't fit us anymore it forces us to beg you or guilt you to fill open seats or positions even if it really isn't going to bring you joy. We just need a body to fill the empty space. No one feels good about this. When you are doing the work of the church, we want it to bring you joy and to fuel your love for this church.

According to the results of the Natural Church Development (NCD) survey that we filled out in spring of 2021, we as a congregation believe that "loving relationships" are one of the top characteristics we need to focus on in order to become a healthier church (see p.4 of the AGM report book). When we are busy working at filling the many roles in the church we become "role centered" instead of "relationship centered". If together we create a structure that allows you to contribute to the workings of the church in a way that fuels your passions and brings you joy, not regret, then we become relationship centered,

Members of Church Council have some ideas we want to share with you at the AGM. And we think it's very important to hear from you too. So, we have prepared a few questions for you to consider. We hope that you will think about your answers to these questions and come to the AGM prepared to hear what we have to say and prepared to share your answers, thoughts and ideas with us.

1. What is it about ABC that you consider "essential"?
2. Who are you here at ABC?
3. How can you help us shift from being a role centered church to a relationship centered church?
