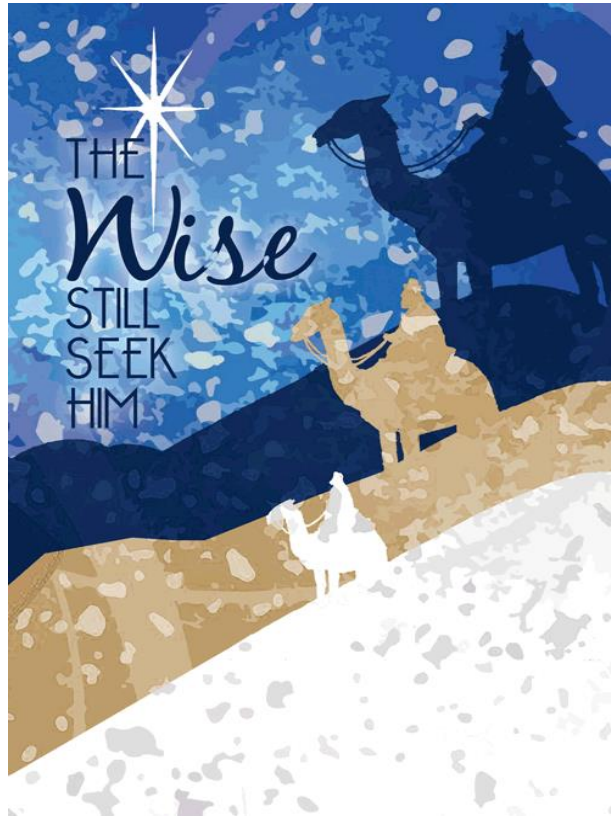

FROM the PASTOR: Mark Tiessen-Dyck

New Year's is a peculiar holiday. What are we celebrating? That our planet completed another trek around the sun? We do measure time by the Earth's movements: a year is one orbit around the sun, a day is one rotation of the Earth on its axis, and smaller measurements of time are fractions of a rotation (one hour being 1/24 of a rotation).

January 1st was designated the New Year's Day many years before the time of Christ, with the first month named after the Roman god of new beginnings (Janus). When the Roman Empire collapsed in the 5th century CE, parts of Christian Europe adopted new dates for the start of a year, typically December 25 and March 25 to coincide with Christmas or the Feast of the Annunciation respectively, thereby coordinating the recognition of time with the Christian story instead of the Roman god. January 1 was again designated New Year's Day in the Gregorian calendar which was created in 1582 and named for the Pope who initiated this updated and standardized calendar. Gradually nations adopted the Gregorian Calendar and we still use it today.

How we designate time and acknowledge its passing is quite arbitrary. However, time is a creation of God and scripture witnesses that God works in time. Time is not meaningless or cyclical, but is moving in a direction, toward something. As Christians it is good to call to mind the doctrine of sanctification at New Year's. Sanctification is the Christian's call to continually grow in holiness, love, and virtue through the grace of God and the power of Holy Spirit. Scripture calls us to "redeem the time" (a literal translation of Ephesians 5:16, other translations capture the meaning as well, such as, "make the most of every opportunity"). What is time if not an opportunity for sanctification? And what is a New Year, if not an occasion to contemplate our sanctification. (Remember, time passes always not just on January 1).
