From the Pastor – Mark Tiessen-Dyck

During Covid, five people from our congregation have died: Carol Buhr, Menno Funk, Dave Wiebe, Chris Penner, and Norm Buhr. One of the difficulties created by Covid and the need for smaller funerals is that our church has been deprived of the opportunity to formally acknowledge the loss of these individuals and the contributions they made (a memorial service for one of the individuals is planned for a later date). I trust that some of this important work of grieving and remembering has occurred in other ways, but the reality of our church's absence at funerals is not lost on me, even as I have had the honour of representing us. I believe it will be important for our congregation to have a time to remember Carol, Menno, Dave, Chris, and Norm. When this will be and what it will look like is yet to be determined.

I have long been a proponent of traditional funerals and burials and their context being the ministry of the church. Not because there isn't room for less traditional arrangements in the practices of the church. It is because I believe we ought to worship God at a funeral; we ought to resist our culture's tendency to avoid confronting our mortality but instead meet death face-to-face with the power of the risen Christ; and we must support those who grieve. Funerals help us do all this. They are an opportunity to remember those we are and who we are.
