FROM the PASTOR: Virginia Gerbrandt Richert

In the past few weeks, I have spent considerable amount of time de-cluttering. I have tried to sort through our piles of toys to figure out which ones are still played with and which ones are just gathering dust. I have sorted through my financial papers as I prepare for tax season. I have sorted through books and files in my office that are no longer relevant or can be put on the shelf for when they might be needed again.

De-cluttering and organizing can feel overwhelming at the start, but afterwards there is a sense of relief and spaciousness as the things that used to take up space have been put away or gotten rid of.

In the same way Lent is meant as a time that invites us to de-clutter our faith, or organize our spiritual life. It is a time when we are invited to think about what aspects or practices of our faith are important and vital, and how do we give them more attention and prominence? And at the same time, what practices of our faith are not as relevant or life-giving anymore and how can we adapt, alter, or let go of them?

The process is not always a pretty one, it tends to create a bit more of a mess before things get better, but it is a worth while one.

We are now half-way through Lent, and I encourage you, if you haven't already, to take some time to reflect on your faith and faith practices in light of these questions. The process or answers might surprise you.
