From the Pastor – Virginia Gerbrandt Richert

This week I have been feeling the grief and loss that many are going through during this time. And the words of Psalm 13 echo in my mind “How long oh Lord?”

How long must we stay away from our family and friends, refraining from hugs and signs of love and affection?

How long must we stay away from the ill in our community?

How long until we can again worship and praise your holy name as a community together in one place with one voice?

How long will we live in fear; fear for ourselves, fear for our economy and fear for the vulnerable in our midst?

How long must we postpone our celebrations; of birthdays, weddings, funerals and graduations?

How long will COVID 19 disrupt our lives?

As far as I can tell no one, not even the special virologist, can answer these questions. So, we are left to ask our God, *how long?* And in the asking lament that it has already been too long. In the asking we name that these things are important to us and these things are a part of our walk as Christians and followers of Christ.

It is my prayer that we all find ways to lament and name our sadness and losses. May we all find ways to walk through our grief, and may we all find the strength to call on God’s name to be near us in all circumstances.

Some questions we may consider for these times are:

- What are the echoes, connections, or resonances between the sermon and what is happening in our lives and our communities?

Our sermon response times will be facilitated by one of the pastors who did not preach. The pastor who preached the sermon for that day’s worship service will participate in the discussion.
