FROM THE PASTOR – Virginia Gerbrandt Richert

This Sunday begins our journey to Christmas. The four weeks of Advent is the time in which we prepare our hearts and our minds to receive Jesus, the Christ child, Emmanuel, God with us.

This year our theme is "**Restoration is Near.**" Restoration is an act of bringing something back to its original condition, or to an improved condition. It is an acknowledgement that things are not as they should be, and could be better. During Advent we are declaring that God is coming to put things right. We are declaring that God sees the brokenness in our world and that restoration is near.

Throughout the weeks of Advent, you will see some examples of restoration in progress– the main visual is a ripped blanket that will be patched back together each week.

But because restoration is not complete, advent symbolizes this time of waiting that we are in, a time of holy waiting. We are longing for God's kingdom to break in. We are longing for that which is broken to be mended and made new again. We are longing for that which is in pieces to be made whole again, and we are longing for God's actions to be made visible, as the Psalmist says in psalm 80 "Restore us, O God: let your face shine, that we may be saved."

So, join us in this time of holy waiting, as we place our trust in the hope of Christmas.
