

FROM the PASTOR - Virginia Gerbrandt Richert

I have been thinking about prayer lately, specifically how we pray and what we pray for. The book that we are reading in our churches book study, "Everything Happens for a Reason," deals with different theological approaches and views of prayer. And though in some ways we might be tempted to label one approach to prayer as "*right*" and the other as "*wrong*", I do not think that prayer can ever be so easily categorized.

So, I sought out more information and input into a biblical understanding of prayer. In a podcast entitled "Ask N.T. Wright Anything", biblical scholar N.T. Wright answers questions about prayer. One of the questions was about how boldly could we pray. Do we pray for complete healing for someone? Or simply someone to experience peace in their struggles? And how do we react when our prayers do not seem to be answered the way that we wanted or expected them to be?

N.T. Wright seemed to say that when we pray, we should err on the side of more rather than less. He said that we should ask for our full desires and not hold anything back. I wonder is this your approach to prayer? If not, why not? Why is it so hard sometimes to pray for the miracle that we so desperately desire? I find myself tending to pray for "safer things" instead of a big miracle, things that I think are easier to answer. Which makes me wonder also, why is it so hard to pray for the miracles that we so desperately desire?

Love Exercise #5

Find reasons to laugh. Celebrate. Notice love. Be creative. Do something just for the fun of it. And thank God for it all.


