**FROM THE PASTOR:** Mark Tiessen Dyck

I have been asked a number of times, "Why this sermon series?" I have tried to answer this in my sermons but will try again here.

I believe there is something beautiful, profound, and truthful about Jesus and living life in him and being community in him. Fundamentalist versions of Christianity distort this and secularism blocks our view of it. The fundamentalist impulse is strong in our area and often those of fundamentalist persuasions present their claims as the core undisputable truths of the Christian faith, even when they are disputable, harmful, or not biblical. People frustrated by fundamentalism, due to the lack of alternative visions and language for a more faithful understanding of what it means to follow Christ, often embrace a secularized faith or worldview. Similarly, people who choose not to engage thoughtfully with the changes in the world or who are unsatisfied with a secular outlook embrace fundamentalism because it appears to be the only way to a biblical faith and life. The assumptions and ideas that create this framework of limited and unsatisfying choices must be challenged.

There is a third way. My hope for our church is that we will be a community that offers a refuge and a challenge to those who are searching for hope, love, and God. I hope that we will walk with Christ in a way that is true, urgent, and hopeful while avoiding the errors of fundamentalism. Pastors are often encouraged to ask, "What does your church offer your community?" I believe we can be for Altona a community that boldly claims a vibrant faith in Christ, while demonstrating that the harms caused by fundamentalism are not our best option.
