FROM the PASTOR ~ Virginia Gerbrandt Richert

I am currently reading the book "Freeing Jesus" by Diana Butler Bass. The title of the book is based on the idea that we tend to put Jesus into a box of our own making—we make Jesus look like us, act like us, believe the same things that we believe, and generally confine his actions and words to things that we are comfortable with.

The book is part memoir, part theology, as Butler Bass systematically tells stories from each decade of her life about the way that she viewed and understood Jesus at that time. Each chapter is titled with the name for Jesus from that decade, and within each chapter she talks about the strengths and weaknesses of that name for Jesus. She includes titles such as friend, teacher, Saviour and Lord.

I have not yet finished the book but I am guessing she will be encouraging us to look at the names that we give to Jesus, how they were shaped in our life, and what purpose they serve in our faith. I have already appreciated the ways that she has deepened my understanding of Jesus as teacher and friend. And realize that no one name is able to encompass everything that Jesus stands for, which is why I appreciate the diversity of names she covers.

What names do you use for Jesus and God, and how have they helped you grow in your faith? Are there names for God that you are just learning to incorporate into your faith practices? How have they encouraged you to grow in your faith and understanding?
