From the Pastor – Mark Tiessen-Dyck

Some wisdom I've heard frequently over the last while is: "Don't waste a good crisis!" Just how Covid will shake up the church is still obscure, but I am convinced there is an opportunity somewhere within this crisis.

A statement that has shaped how I think of the church is, "the church doesn't have a mission, but God's mission has a church." For churches and institutions that are established and been around for a long time, our fundamental purpose and vision is often neglected and we become preoccupied with self-perpetuation and maintaining our structure. Our mission becomes the organization or the structure, rather than our structure and organization serving the mission. I couldn't agree more with Brian McLaren who says we need less organized religion and more organizing religion. One hope of mine is that through this crisis our vision as a congregation becomes clear and we are inspired to organize, not for organization's sake, but for the mission of God.
