FROM THE PASTOR: Mark Tiessen-Dyck

Continuing my From the Pastor's Desk series on Funerals...

Many people have had the experience of attending a funeral and heard the deceased praised beyond measure and left wondering if the person who died was even human!? (or if you showed up at the wrong person's funeral). In not wanting to be an example of this, sometimes we react by saying that we don't want any tributes or any flowers or anything beyond the bare minimum at our funeral because we don't want to be like those people who are unrealistically lauded at their funerals. We may be seeking to model humility in such a response, but there can also be a hidden arrogance (look how humble I am!) within it.

A Christian funeral is grounded in the love and faithfulness of God, the creator of life and the giver of eternal life. Because we rely on God's love and grace for our life and salvation, we have freedom to recognize sins, regrets, and unfinished goals and grapple with these issue and the troubles they bring. I have experienced these realities being named at funerals in ways that honour the deceased and edify the living. Sometimes leaving these realities unnamed creates an 'elephant in the room' (particularly if there are challenging circumstances surrounding the death) and this does not honour God or serve the living. Also, remembering the nature of God frees us from burdens such as: should we get the extra fancy coffin and what if there aren't enough flowers?! Simple can be beautiful.

Because a Christian funeral is centred on God, we must also name and celebrate the goodness present in the life of the deceased for this is an expression of God's goodness. Funerals are important times to celebrate relationships and love and the connections that impacted the people who remain. In Christ we are not defined by our sins and so we do not need to see funerals as an opportunity to be focused on our sins, even though the deceased is a sinner just like the rest of us.

In addition to the grief of loss, we can also experience regret at funerals. Regret for things we did or did not do, and regret for things that our deceased loved one did or did not do. Funerals are a reminder that God is at work to redeem all things, including our memories, our lives, our relationships, and our character.

To the supporting churches of MCI:

You are invited and urged to attend **a meeting on April 25th at 7 pm** at MCI regarding the future of Mennonite Collegiate Institute in Gretna, Manitoba. The Board wishes to provide information about the school, including student numbers, finances and future plans.

Important decisions will need to be made in the near future. As per the constitution and the articles of incorporation, supporting/ society/ member churches hold the decision-making authority for MCI and therefore are responsible for corporate decisions. All who support the school are welcome and invited, but we are also **requesting delegates from member churches**. This will be an information meeting, with a special corporation meeting date, as needed, to be decided at the meeting on the 25th of April.

As per MCI constitution, each member church is entitled one vote per 20 members and a delegate may carry one proxy vote (representing a total of 40 members). Every congregation represented shall present a written list of voting delegates to the secretary of the corporation at the meeting, and their number of votes. Kristen Falk is our representative on the MCI Board of Directors and will attend the meeting. We are also encouraging other members of our church family, who care for MCI and its future, to attend the meeting on April 25th.
