FROM THE PASTOR: Mark Tiessen-Dyck

David Scott, from Swan Lake First Nation, is an Elder, Knowledge Keeper, and a very sought-after speaker. He has spoken widely on Indigenous history including land claims, the Indian Act, and traditional Indigenous knowledge. He speaks Ojibwe, Cree, and English. I'm very grateful and honoured that he has agreed to come to Brunch Church and speak to our congregation.

I first heard about David Scott by learning of his knowledge of a treaty between the Ojibwe and the Mennonites (this story was shared with him by previous Elders and Knowledge Keepers). In preparation for Brunch Church, I encourage you to read the graphic retelling of a June 2023 tour which is attached to the bulletin email.

David's sharing with us will not be a sermon, as in our typical worship practice, but it will be an opportunity for us to continue learning part of our history, the history of our land, and the journey toward reconciliation. As is David's practice, there will be an opportunity for questions and responses to his sharing.

Awareness of "The Secret Treaty" gives me hope. Even though our history in filled with wrongs and the relationships between Mennonites and Indigenous people have not always been just, there was a moment when Mennonites and Ojibwe entered a Treaty of peace as equals. If it can happen in the past, it can happen in the future too. I encourage everyone to come to Brunch Church, and engage with the teachings of David Scott with curiosity, hope, and love in the spirit of Jesus.

Brunch Church is in two weeks on May 5. It begins at 9:15. Brunch is provided by our youth. This is a fundraiser for summer camp at Matheson Island. Altona Mennonite Church will be joining us.

However, at least nine people have been reported killed, more than 900 injured, and property damage is widespread. The Mennonite hospital in Hualien is prepared to receive emergency patients. From the Finance committee: Thank you for your continued financial support of Bergthaler Mennonite Church, and the variety of outreach programs we

extend on your behalf in our church and the wider community. Here are some highlights prepared by Laurie Enns, as of April 14th. Thanks to increased rental income and Sunday morning offerings, our overall revenue is tracking ahead of 2023 totals. On the expense side, Outreach, Property and Maintenance totals are virtually unchanged from 2023. Salaries, Education and Local Ministries are somewhat higher than 2023 expenditures. Overall, the year-to-date shortfall is approximately \$39,478 which is approximately \$1100.00 ahead of 2023 figures. We continue to have many reasons to be thankful at ABC. Thanks also for your presence at the congregational special meeting which approved the offer to purchase for the surplus lot.
