In our worship service this week we welcome Jayme Giesbrecht, Director of Development at the Eden Foundation.

Next Sunday Lent Begins. This year our journey to the cross will be guided by the theme, "The Last Week". We will be taking a magnifying glass to the final week of Jesus' life: What he did, what he taught, the controversies he was involved in, and the questions he was asked. Our hope is that by exploring Jesus' last week we will better understand what hangs in the balance of Jesus' life and death. In keeping with the purpose of Lent, our worship services will include times of confessing sins and receiving God's grace.

Lent will begin with Palm Sunday (instead of the Sunday before Easter) because this event is the start of Jesus' last week. We will also have the opportunity to come forward and receive ashes as practiced in an Ash Wednesday service.

- Feb. 25: Jesus disrupts the temple. Matthew 21:12-17. Speaker: Mark

- March 10: Bags of gold. Matthew 25:14-30. Speaker: Jason Driedger
- March 17: The last supper. Matthew 26:17-30 (John 13:1-20). Speaker: Mark
- March 24: Jesus in the garden. Matthew 21:31-56. Speaker: Terrell

You may recall the discussion at last year's AGM regarding our constitution, and the expressed desire for a review. Following the meeting, Ben Dueck and Melissa Tiessen-Dyck volunteered to join a Church Council Rep (AI Friesen) for a series of spring conversations which ultimately focused on a number of areas for an updated constitution that reflected our current needs at ABC.

- Commission size, length of service terms, and make up.
- Recognition of the value and service of "non-members" who enthusiastically provide leadership throughout our administration structure.
- Review (and formalize) administrative practices that are currently in place.
- update terms and language related to job descriptions.
- Affirm the many areas of our constitution that continue to remain relevant.
- Strive to make the revised constitution more readable.

A draft was prepared for Church Council in spring, and subsequently discussed at length by Church Council this fall. These discussions also included a member of the most recent revision committee over 20 years ago. A final draft was approved by Church Council at our January meeting. It was agreed that a copy would be made available to the congregation (e-copy and paper) by Feb 11.
