

- International witness: Pray for Palestinian Christian brothers and sisters who seek to be faithful witnesses to God's peace amid heightened conflict, and an end to the injustices at the root of the violence. During the last month, tensions in Palestine and Israel have risen as Israel's new extremist government threatens to accelerate the confiscation of land for more settlements in the occupied territories. So far this year, at least 50 people have been killed and many more injured. At least three quarters of the victims are Palestinian some of them militants and others innocent civilians and the rest are Israeli soldiers and settlers.

FROM THE PASTOR: Virginia Gerbrandt Richert

This week Wednesday Feb 22 begins the season of Lent in the Christian calendar. Lent is the 40-day season of preparation for the celebration of Easter and Jesus' resurrection. Lent has not traditionally been observed in Mennonite churches, but as we have learned from our more liturgical brothers and sisters we have come to see the value and importance that this season can serve for our faith. In these traditions Lent would begin with an Ash Wednesday service and the imposition of ashes to remind us of our mortality and need for renewal.

Some years our church held an Ash Wednesday service, to mark the beginning of lent. But as schedules shifted and attendance dwindled, we adapted.

This year we are going to bring this practice back into the worship life of our congregation. Instead of a Wednesday evening, though, we are planning our Sunday morning worship like an Ash Wednesday service.

So, next Sunday, Feb 26, we are going to include a time of confession, repentance, and preparation in our service. We are going to be inviting people to receive the mark of ashes on their forehead. And we are going to acknowledge our own frailty as humans and our need for God's love and care in our lives. As would all be typical of any Ash Wednesday service.

If this sounds very solemn, it can be, but does not have to be joyless, because within every service we also include the hope we have in God's grace and desire to cleanse and forgive us. And after the service we will gather for lunch and fellowship and our AGM to discuss and dream together where God is leading this congregation.
