FROM THE PASTOR – Mark Tiessen-Dyck

A while back, Al Friesen saw our caretaker mowing the grass beyond the parking lot across from the church building. This raised the question, why do we maintain, or even own, this land that we do not use and could be used for other purposes? Our church possesses surplus land and, as previously reported by the Finance Commission, the process to have the land subdivided is underway.

This situation has led Church Council to return to conversations about Treaties and land acknowledgements. When we initially begun doing land acknowledgments a couple years ago, we insisted that we did not want land acknowledgments to be empty words or merely performative statements void of real action or change. This is sometimes how land acknowledgements feel, according to feedback I have heard. At council, we hoped that land acknowledgements were the beginning, not the completion of our work at reconciliation; a sign of our commitment not a 'box to check'.

The situation we are now in, as owners of surplus land, is a blessing in that it provides an opportunity to reflect, and possibly act, on our increasing awareness that we are Treaty people. And so, on behalf of Church Council, as pastors we will be facilitating a couple adult Sunday school classes to explore this situation. Please note that these classes will not be a time to make decisions about what to do with the land, nor will our primary focus be on generating ideas about what to do with the land. It is not church council's intent to approach this situation with any predetermined outcome. These adult Sunday school classes are an opportunity to discuss the situation together, explore the history and significance of Treaties, and cultivate an awareness and openness to the Holy Spirit's leading in how we might be faithful stewards of surplus land.

Everyone is invited to these times of discussion and engagement in the church basement the next two Sunday mornings (Feb 12 and 19) at 9:15.
