FROM THE PASTOR: Mark Tiessen-Dyck

On Wednesday Shelby Penner, Nicholas Funk, Leo Dyck, Terrell and myself travelled to Matheson Island, a fishing community of about 150 people. The community is very remote; it is a long drive north along Lake Winnipeg and involves a small ferry crossing onto the island (or an ice road in winter). There is a school in the community that has about 15 students from kindergarten to grade 9 (once students reach high school they must board in Gimli, Selkirk, or Winnipeg). Mennonite Church Manitoba has long standing involvements at Matheson Island and when we met with some local leaders, we heard about their longing for a greater church presence in their community. There is a chapel which Mennonite Church Manitoba technically owns and has been used for worship services for years but currently is empty. When Terrell and Janna were pastors at Springfield Heights Mennonite Church, their youth group led a summer camp for children at Matheson Island for several years in partnership with the community. For Terrell, this trip was a bit of a reunion as he reconnected with a couple of people he knew from years back.

Melanie Neufeld from MCM joined us as well; she has been connecting with Matheson Island over the last year and invited our church and Altona Mennonite Church into the conversation. The purpose of our trip was to explore the possibility of developing a partnership and doing a camp or VBS at the Island next summer. We heard a strong desire for activities and biblical teaching for the children of the community who do not have the opportunities that kids in towns and cities have. We did spend some time playing with kids and youth, who were invited in advance to come for some games. About 20 children came, some of whom did not live on the island but were visiting relatives during summer break. Our time concluded with a meal that people from the community had prepared which included bannock and moose stew, among other dishes.

Most of all: (vs.1) Most of all, let love guide you. Most of all, let love be true. No need to play those games, so make love your greatest aim. Most of all, let love guide you.

(vs. 2) Be aware of what's inside. Be aware of what you hide, Honest with the one who loves you as you are, be aware of what's inside.

(vs. 3) Keep your eyes upon the Lord. Feed upon His living Word. Let the Spirit do, a holy work in you. Keep your eyes upon the Lord. (Repeat verse 1).

Hello from Finance and Maintenance: Our church has passed the halfway point of our financial calendar year. Based on reports compiled by church accountant Laurie Enns, despite a significant furnace repair, and sizeable insurance hike, our overall expenses continue to track below 2023 budget and 2022 totals, at \$238,976.00. It should also be noted that offering contributions, at the halfway point, are tracking at approx \$31,000 behind the pace of 2022, resulting in an overall deficit to date of \$25,969.75. As a result, Finance made the decision to temporarily scale back our quarterly outreach contributions by 50%. We are gratified for the financial contributions to date provided by those who call Bergthaler Church home and continue to have confidence in a positive 2nd half of 2023. In an unrelated matter, Town of Altona has approved the proposed subdivision of our property to the east of the sanctuary. As the paperwork is completed, it is our intention to reach out to you for a conversation on the appropriate way to proceed (or not). Thank you, Laurie Enns, Elmer Friesen, Al Friesen
