Children's Story: Delores Enns

Today we start a sermon series on the biblical prophets called, "God's Spokespeople". In this series we'll be exploring the message of the prophets in their contexts and seek a prophetic imagination for our present time.

June 16. Micaiah son of Imlah and the role of prophets. Speaker: Virginia

FROM THE PASTOR: Terrell Wiebe

A look inside a youth event. "Youth Talk Night: God is Love" A 45-minute conversation summed up in 400 words.

Terrell: What kinds of things do you love? **Youth:** Food, sleep, books, video games, volleyball, being outside, weekends.

T: What about love for other people? Is that the same kind of feeling or a different one? **Y**: It's different. Deeper than the love we have for things. **Y**: Aren't there different names for love? Like agape and philia?

T: Yes! Wow! Who taught you that?!? Those are Greek words for love. One of them is *philia* – which is like the love of a friend or sibling. Another is *eros*, which is a romantic love. And *agape* is unconditional love, like the love God has for us, God's children.

T: This year we have talked about how God loves our anger, flaws, emotions, and weirdness. And the reason that God loves those things about us that we often think are negative is because God is love.

The group reads 1 John 4:7-12 (sample) "Everyone who loves is born of God and experiences a relationship with God...because God is love."

T: If God <u>is</u> love, it means that God loves us no matter what. We don't have to earn God's love. We don't have to be a Christian or say the right things or act a certain way to be loved by God. We already have God's love.

T: There is a belief that love is a need. What are other needs that we have? **Y:** Sleep, food, water, clothing, a home. **T:** Yes, those are our basic needs. There are also psychological needs like friendship, a feeling of accomplishment, and love!

T: Love is a need. Which is why God's love is a gift to us and why we seek love from others. It is also why our lives are better when we are loved and when we have love for others.

T: The thing about love, though, is that we don't always succeed. There are things that get in the way of love. Can you think of any? **Y:** Greed, selfishness, anger, others being annoying.

T: Right! It's hard to love sometimes, and we often fail. But there is one who has mastered love and for whom nothing can get in the way. And that is God.

The group reads Romans 8:38-39 (sample) "nothing can separate us from God's love in Christ Jesus our Lord."

Youth spend a few minutes reading through the two scripture texts again. Then they choose a word or phrase that sticks out to them about God's love, write it on a heart shaped piece of paper and tape it up around the youth room. (See bottom of "Church Announcements")
