

## FROM THE PASTOR: Virginia Gerbrandt Richert

Almost 500 years ago, in 1525, a group of Christians in Zurich, Switzerland gathered together to study scripture and discuss their faith and through this decided to baptise one another. This believer's baptism has become known as the beginning of the Anabaptist movement and is one of the places we trace our beginnings as a Mennonite church.

Now, Mennonites and Anabaptists from around the world are looking to the year 2025 to celebrate 500 years since that first baptism. One aspect of this celebration is acknowledging what has all changed in the past 500 years. This movement that began as a fringe part of the Reformation is now active in most countries in the world. It began with an act that was punishable by death, and now we in North America practice believer's baptisms without any threat or thought to its political nature.

Another big part of the celebration is sharing and affirming ways that individuals and churches are living into our Mennonite and Anabaptist Christian faith. So, I want to pose the question to you, how do you see people living out their faith in inspiring and creative ways? Or what have you seen that has given you a glimpse of God at work among us? Or where have you seen signs of hope and reconciliation in our community?

If you have stories, I would love to hear them and also share them with the broader Mennonite Anabaptist community.
