FROM THE PASTOR: Virginia Gerbrandt Richert

I recently attended the funeral of a friend of mine who died of cancer in his 30's. His family was keenly aware of the tendency to make people out to be saints once they have passed away. So, they made sure to note that he was not perfect and definitely had his faults. At the same time, they chose to focus more on his strengths.

One such characteristic was his ability to deal with the many griefs that he experienced in his life and not allow them to overwhelm him or turn him bitter. Instead, he chose to embrace life and seek out the joy that could be found in each day and in each circumstance. One example was his skill with words and humour. He loved to laugh and was especially fond of puns. And in his last weeks, when his communication was limited to one or two words at best, he still found the energy to make jokes or point out the absurd, offering the gift of smiles and laughter to those around him.

This pushed me to reflect on my own life and how I have responded to griefs or tragedies around me. As well as an encouragement to seek out the good, pursue joy, and remember that in all things love can be made visible.

At the funeral we were encouraged to keep his memory alive as we followed his example and embraced the life that is before us. And I couldn't think of a better way to honour his memory.

Thank you to those of you who have inquired about our ABC finances to date. Here are some highlights as of October 25th, prepared by Church Treasurer Laurie Enns. Overall income is currently at \$310,475.02 of which the Sunday morning offering total is \$294,853.00. Unfortunately, this is tracking approximately \$40,000 behind last year. On the positive side, the year to date expenses are currently within 2023 budgeted totals. We also thank all commissions who have successfully maintained expenditures below 2022 figures. On your behalf, Finance and Trusteeship has also completed third quarter outreach contributions (or overall at 62.5 % of our annual budget). We continue to thank you for your financial support of ABC and are hopeful that the current deficit of \$38,889.96 will decrease in this final portion of 2023.
