FROM THE PASTOR: Josh Janzen

In my office hangs an icon known as "Rublev's Trinity". It depicts the story from Genesis 18 where Abraham and Sarah had the chance to welcome God in three visitors showed up at their door. For me, it serves as a reminder that God is never far removed from the people and places outside of my door or my home.

That in itself is a comfort as I take stock of the world, we find ourselves in today. In general, I consider myself to be an optimistic person. In the midst of hard things, my tendency is to remind myself and others of hope and that good things are still possible. But even for me, there are times when I find myself overwhelmed, angry, stressed and anxious when I consider our world. From war and genocide in countries that make it into the news, to country that don't, to natural disasters and cycles of harsh drought and overwhelming floods of rain. From the reality of an ongoing pandemic that we are just sort of moving on from even though people are still getting sick, to an almost daily reminder of violent shootings in the US that are being allowed to continue based on some's view that the right to own an assault weapon is more sacred than a right to life.

The world can be an awful place sometimes, and it seems like the entirety of creation is crying out in travail. And unfortunately, it seems like the world has always been in travail. We have seen violence, death, trauma, and struggle from generation to generation. As we continue to live in this world, it can be all too easy to become numb, to be resigned to these realities, to shut ourselves off from the world. Even now as I write, I am wanting to continue right on into my message of hope (which will come). But want all of us to at least take a moment to pause and let ourselves feel whatever it that we need to feel, and just give a big sigh as we let it out.

Now, as we worship on the Sunday of Pentecost, we are reminded of God's pouring out of the Holy Spirit upon us. As we pray for our world around us, for our church, for each other, let us be reminded of God's presence with us and be empowered by it. God is never far removed from the peoples and places outside our doors. Let us pray, and let us go out into this broken, beautiful world and meet God there as we work towards bringing God's kingdom on Earth as it is in Heaven.
