As a council we have also decided to follow the same course of action as the schools in our area. If schools are closed, we will be closed too. So as of right now, church services will not resume before April 12th - Easter Sunday. We really hope that we can be together for Easter Sunday and will keep you posted as we get closer to that date. For now though, our facility will officially be closed to everyone except for staff. This is also to allow our staff to work from home when necessary at a time when they are also being affected by school closures. That doesn't mean that our pastors are unavailable to you. They are still reachable by phone - office or cell - or email. All of that information can be found in this bulletin. While our Sunday morning services and our programs are suspended, many of our expenses are not. We ask that you consider continued giving during this time. One way is through on-line giving. Call the church office or Don and Grace if you would like to get set up for this option. Other options include through the post office or contact the office to have someone from church council pick up your gift. It is our desire to continue in Christ's service during these uncertain times. We ask for your prayers for our world, our pastors, and our leaders as they navigate this unprecedented situation. We look forward to gathering with all of you again soon.

 - As schools cancel classes across the country and congregations gauge whether or not to hold services, Mennonite Church Canada has updated web resources created by the Mennonite Church Canada Pandemic and Response Taskforce during the last flu pandemic in 2009-2010.

Instead we are working towards the smallest ceremony that we can plan, with the hope of our wedding day still being Saturday April 11. Pray for us as we begin our life together.

ABC family, you are resilient and you live out your faith, loving and supporting those who need it. It is in times like this that those qualities will serve us well. Beloved of God, serve one another; love one another. Call a friend, make a grocery run for an elderly neighbor.
